News from the EFB

At the recent policy event in Tirana and the public presentation of the BiEPAG publication latest on regional cooperation in the Western Balkans, BiEPAG's Members Richard Grieveson (Deputy Director, Vienna Institute for International Economic Studies) and Jovana Marović (Former Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of European Affairs in Government of Montenegro) had a meeting with the members of the beeEFB Alumni Network coming from the public and the private sector in Albania.



They engaged in an open discussion on different cross-cutting aspects of regional cooperation concerning the stalemate of the EU Integration process, the repercussions of the war in Ukraine, and the Open Balkan and Berlin Process initiatives platforms for high-level cooperation between high official representatives of the Western Balkan Six (WB6).

Green Mobility Project, Volume 2

Remember the project idea financed through the beeEFB Alumni Joint Initiatives last year? A project team member, Tihana Lolić, shares how the project idea received institutional support from the Ministry of Spatial Planning, Civil Engineering and Ecology of the Republic of Srpska, Bosnia, and Herzegovina, and the Environmental Protection and Energy Efficiency Fund of the RS, to continue finance project activities. This collaboration has resulted in coordination between the Ministry, the Fund, and the Green Mobility group members regarding further actions. In June 2023, a new mural based on the drawing of a 3rd-grade student was created (third place in a previous competition).



Recognizing the significance of raising awareness about environmental protection and green urban mobility, the above institutions will provide funding and support for similar actions in other cities of the RS. This collaboration will enable the implementation of projects that environmental promote consciousness sustainable and transportation in various urban areas.

We encourage other network members to get involved and take actions that can lead to improvements in their communities.



This initiative is a clear example of how a small project can have a significant impact and how Alumni from the region can successfully collaborate in addressing challenges. BeeEFB Alumni have the power to act together and bring about positive changes to create a better and more prosperous society.

National Coordinators

We recently opened a call for National Coordinators and we are delighted to announce we now have **seven (7) National Coordinators** within our Network.

A National Coordinator (NC) is an EFB Alumni who builds and maintains beneficial relationships, facilitates communication and coordinates activities among the country Alumni

Alumni. NCs will act as coordinators for the Alumni of the country they represent. They will be the contact point to build relationships with the EFB Alumni at the national level, facilitate cooperation among the host person of the national meet-up and countries for the regional meet-up, and increase Alumni engagement within the network.

National Coordinators will also be responsible for identifying collaboration options with their fellow NCs from the region, such as identifying potential for regional collaboration. Taken together, NCs will additionally revive the network and foster active engagement alongside the current Board and other interested stakeholders.

We are happy that we can share with you that the selection process of the 2nd cohort of the beeEffect programme was completed by the end of June and **13 participants** from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Greece Montenegro, North Macedonia, Romania, Serbia, and Turkiye were selected.
