The beeEffect Programme





The Mentors have developed tailor-made agreements and will play a crucial role in delivering knowledge and useful set of skills in the upcoming 3-4 months, in the same way as case study advisors will help participants develop 4 case studies, which will be presented in the Annual event in early 2023. Meanwhile, participants will also get to engage in various online sessions during the upcoming period, in their quest towards learning and knowledge.

Looking back at a decade ago, the first EFB Community Conference under the motto "People, Ideas, Networks" was carried out as a 3-day programme in October 2012 in Zagreb. Divided into two groups of Butterflies and Bumblebees, they were all following the rule of the Two Feet "Go to where you are learning and contributing".

The result of the initial brainstorming among the different working groups gave extraordinary feedback on a list of important themes that deserved the special attention and interest for all the affected parties, the representatives from the Western Balkans and the political.

The study visit to Brussels of engaged individuals and representatives of civil society organizations from the Western Balkans took place between 10-13 October. The purpose of the visit was to create a strong network of these identified change-makers and to connect them with European counterparts, decision makers and journalists.

During the study visit, meetings were used to advocate for the greater engagement and visibility of the EU with the civil society in the Balkans. The environmental issues and challenges in the region were highlighted as exceptionally acute along with the vulnerable and fragile position that civil society faces.

The participants, even though coming from all countries from the Western Balkans, were speaking with one voice sending the message that European values are still alive and kicking in the region and that those who promote them deserve greater support.
